What is Zoom?

Overview

Zoom is a video and web conferencing application. While it shares some similarities with other applications like Skype for Business, Zoom is tailored specifically for multi-user, collaborative functionality.

OTS Media & Classroom Services is now piloting Zoom for instructional use, allowing—among other things—instructors to hold office hours remotely, and online students to attend and participate in classes alongside in-person students.

All UB students are only eligible for a Basic user account, while all UB faculty, and staff are automatically eligible for a Licensed user account. Both licenses have access to all the features outlined here and on the Zoom webpage, with conference length being the primary difference between license tiers; Basic users can only host meetings lasting 40 minutes or less, while Pro users do not have this limitation. Easily meet online from anywhere

- Never miss a class
 - It's easy to attend Zoom meetings online from wherever you are, on whatever device works best—Skype for Business works on PC, Mac, and all smartphone platforms

 - Set up a video conference in advance with Outlook and Google integration, or on the fly with a personalized Meeting ID

Presenter Options

Share desktop – allow your attendees to see your desktop, from applications to web pages

Share specific programs – restrict your screen-sharing to particular applications so that your attendees only see what you want them to see

Whiteboard – draw, annotate, and save your work with this digital whiteboard feature

Breakout Rooms – automatically or manually break your class into small groups that you can pop in and out of to watch their progress.

Record – capture your sessions so they can be watched later
